Method of Scoring

Don't forget:

- Batting starts with 200 runs
- Runs added to total
- 5 runs deducted if batter is out
- Give extra ball for a Wide or No ball in final over of each innings only

•	=	no run, no wicket
W	=	wicket taken
1/2/3	=	runs scored
O	=	No ball – number of runs written inside circle
()	=	Wide – number of runs inside bracket

Example of a two over spell (5 runs deducted for lost wicket)

1st Over:

no run	wide (no extra runs scored from it)
four	no run
wicket falls	one run
7 runs scored, 1 wicket lost; $200+7 = 207-5 = 202$	

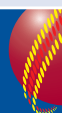
2nd Over:

wicket	one run
one run	three runs
three runs (from a no ball)	no runs
8 runs scored, 1 wicket lost; $202+8 = 210-5 = 205$
