MARYLEBONE CRICKET CLUB v OMAN (40 overs)

Match Report: Geoff Knight

The final fixture of the tour is a 40 over daytime match against the full Oman National Team.

Oman won the toss and invited MCC to take first knock. The valuable wicket of Kadeer Ali was lost in the first over. The batsmen found it difficult to score runs against the tight Omani bowling and their excellent fielding. Several batsmen made a start but with the exception of Will Gidman none seemed able to progress to a decent score. At the halfway stage of the innings MCC was 70 for 4. The only significant stand of the innings was that of 39 runs between Richard King and Will Gidman for the fifth wicket before Richard King was bowled by the Omani captain Hemal Mehta for 16. The lower order failed to add significantly to the total and 95 for 5 in the twenty-fifth over became 129 all out off 34.1 overs. Will Gidman was the only batsman who looked at all comfortable against the home attack and he top scored with an invaluable 47.

The MCC total looked rather inadequate as after losing two early wickets the third wicket pair, Vaibhav and Trivedi seemed well in control. At lunch the home side was cruising at 50 for 2 off fifteen overs. However something in the lunch seemed to affect the Omani batsmen adversely and the MCC bowlers advantageously as on the resumption the next nine overs saw the home team's score crumble to 80 for 6 and it seemed the tide had well and truly turned in favour of MCC. The crucial wicket was that of Vaibhav who fell to a catch by Richard King off the bowling of skipper Keith Dutch for his side's top score of 43. There was some late resistance from Hemal Mehta but once he was trapped LBW by Richard King the innings soon ended on 114 giving MCC a well earned victory by 15 runs to maintain the 100 per cent record on this tour. The pick of the bowlers were Kadeer Ali 3 for 17 off 7.1 overs, Richard King 2 for 7 off 3 overs and Luke Jarvis with 2 for 22 off 8 overs.

Thus the playing side of the tour has ended with a clean sweep of seven victories in seven matches.
