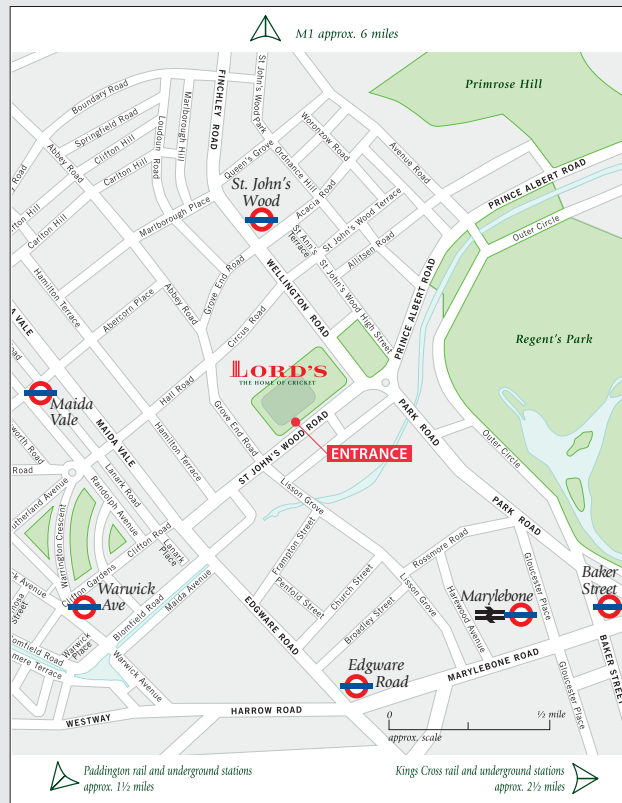

DIRECTIONS

The Tours entrance is located at the Grace Gate (see above). St John's Wood is the closest tube station (approximately 15 minutes' walk), and Warwick Avenue, Marylebone, Edgware Road and Baker Street are all within 20 minutes' walk. MCC Museum – Housing an unrivalled collection of cricket art and memorabilia, the Museum collection comprises over 30,000 exhibits and is best-known for being home to the Ashes Urn.



Pavilion – One of the most celebrated buildings in the sporting world, the Pavilion never fails to make an extraordinary impression. Built in 1889 as the clubhouse for MCC, this fine example of Victorian architecture houses the famous Long Room and Players' Dressing Rooms.



Real Tennis – The real tennis court at Lord's is one of around only 42 in the world; 25 in the UK and of just four in London. This fascinating, complex and intriguing sport was a known favourite of King Henry VIII.

THE HOME OF CRICKET EST. 1787

The most famous cricket ground in the world, Lord's is a place where legends are made. Founded by Thomas Lord in 1787 as the home of Marylebone Cricket Club, it moved to its current site in St John's Wood in 1814, and is now the ultimate destination for international players and cricket fans alike.

Steeped in history and charm, with extraordinary architecture and a fascinating collection of cricketing art and memorabilia, including the iconic Ashes Urn, Lord's is the Home of Cricket.
